The Power of Discussion

Discussing books together really helps develop both your child's understanding of texts and the skills needed to succeed in reading. These are some helpful questions you might like to ask your child before you read a book together:





What is the title of the book?



What kind of book is it? (Fiction, non-fiction or poetry)



Who is the author/illustrator?



Have you read any other books by the same author?



 \nearrow What do you think the book might be about? What clues can you find in the blurb?

Comics Directions


Bug Club
