Learning in School	
Literacy	This term our first topic is 'Happily Ever After.' We will be looking at the stories, Farmer Duck, The Gingerbread Man, The Three Little Pigs and Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We will practise using story language to retell and sequence each story and describe the different characters and settings. After half term our topic will be 'On the Move.' We will be reading the stories How to Catch a Star, The Train Ride, Hundred Decker Bus and Ruby's Worry. We will also be focussing on recognising our name and writing some or all of the letters in our name.
Phonics	We will be focussing on alliteration, initial sounds and orally segmenting and blending words in Phonics. Singing and rhyming is something we do everyday in Nursery.
Maths	In Summer 1, we will be learning about sequencing nursery rhymes, daily routines and stories. We will learn positional language, and compare objects using the vocabulary more and fewer. We will also be learning about 2D and 3D shapes. In summer 2 we will be working on number composition with numerals to 5, looking at what comes before and after in a number line and consolidating our learning with numerals 1-5.
Communication	To support the development of our speaking and listening skills, we will be continuing to listen to stories daily, using our narrative skills to extend the story or think of alternative endings. We will use our language skills to solve problems with our friends and explore 'I wonder' questions to encourage thinking skills and extra challenges.
PSED	This term we will continue to build relationships with our friends in class and welcome the new children into Nursery. We will continue to follow the rules and routines in class and use our restorative practice to talk about how we and others might be feeling. We will also be doing lots of transition activities to support our move into Reception and develop confidence in our new setting.
Physical Development	Throughout the year we will be developing our fine and gross motor skills. We have a range of resources in the classroom to develop fine motor skills, such as playdough, scissors, tweezers, Duplo, threading shapes and many more. We will continue to develop our fine motor skills to help with our pencil control so we can comfortably hold pens and pencils. We will also be encouraging the children to have a go writing some of the letters in their name, with support from teachers and their name cards. We will go outside every day and have a range of equipment to develop movement, balancing and ball skills. We will use a range of resources such as, crates and blocks to build obstacle courses, a wide variety of different balls, sweeping brushes and rollers and large buckets and spades to dig with.
The World	We have lots of opportunities in provision and during carpet sessions to learn about key festivals this season such as Eid. We will talk about how Eid is celebrated and share our experiences in class. We will also have a visit from the Farm and the planetarium to support our topic work. We will continue to look after our plants in the garden and watch how they grow as the season changes and the weather becomes warmer. We will be learning about different countries and the types of animals that live there. We will also be learning about space and the different planets.
Expressive Arts and Design	This term we will continue to explore the creative areas of the classroom. We will colour mix with the powder paint, make models and will have the opportunity to use our imaginations while playing in the home corner and small world areas. We will continue to develop our musical skills and have a go making up our own songs and rhymes, which we can perform to other members of the class.
